Realizing the Dream

It was wonderful seeing all of you at AGPA's 75th Anniversary Meeting celebration. The milestone achievements that we came together to recognize were literally the things we dreamed of in our not so distant past.

We used to dream of ways to bring in the next generation of group therapists to grow their leadership skills and pass on our cumulative knowledge. We used to dream of ways that we could underwrite the Annual Meeting that would ensure the continued standard of excellence that has always been part of our training events. We also dreamed of ways we could strengthen our relationships within our membership family at the national and the local level so we could continue our connections beyond our Annual Meeting. Because we were big dreamers, we also dreamed of underwriting group therapy research so we could continue to support the efficacy of group work and share it with the greater world.

Now that I have shared our collective dreams, as group therapists love to do, I want to share with you the amazing reality of what we have achieved. We have developed a Scholarship Program extraordinaire. The Scholarship Program was the first fund raising effort that captured our hearts and our community spirit of giving. This year, we awarded more than 200



scholarships, and collectively more than 1,500 during the program's existence. You can see the positive impact of the program in the faces of the hundreds of the new professionals who are filling our conference, and now our leadership positions. It's inspirational.

Beyond the Scholarship Program, 16 events at our Annual Meeting are now endowed through capital gifts. This has allowed us to bring the most relevant issues, presented by prominent speakers, researchers, and clinicians to our Public Events. A wonderful example of this is the Anne and Ramon Alonso Plenary given at our 2017 75th Anniversary Meeting. Plenary Speaker Elisabeth Rohr, PhD, who has extensively researched migration, fundamentalism, gender, and supervision, gave a stellar address on migration called *Humanity on the Move—Groups Too?*, which was research-based and deeply moving. Its relevance to our current national and international struggles was alive in the audience's intense and personal responses to the material. It was an incredible public event.

This year, we also instituted Single Event Tribute Programs and Scholarships to honor leaders in our communities and to raise funds for the Foundation. Five events and two scholarships honoring 21 past and present leaders were supported; you can see their names and the donors in this issue.

Thanks to all of you who have contributed so much of your time, talent, heart, and pledges, to help us realize these dreams.

We also continue, in cooperation with our Affiliate Societies, to conduct local events to raise funds for the Foundation. The events have successfully raised funds, and have also been wonderful ways to come together as a community, many times to honor our local leaders. These fun and meaningful celebrations also strengthen the local society's ties to AGPA. It's a great way to keep the fires of the Annual Meeting burning all year long. I hope you will attend an event in your community or think about hosting one yourself.

LOOKING TO THE FUTURE

We are now looking to the future and ways to expand our programs and our dreams. Our three-year 75th Anniversary Campaign has an overarching goal of reaching \$7.5 million in giving over the lifetime of the Foundation, along with a goal of increasing our annual giving, which will allow us to sustain and increase our programs. Our focus is in the areas of scholarships, research, Affiliate Society support, agency training, community outreach, and technology. We have learned that fund raising skills are not a product of marketing or advertising, but are skills built on the foundation of relationships. Somehow, I think we should have known that, when in our teachings and trainings we often say, "It's all about the relationship."

To achieve our new fund raising goals, we first began working with our organizational leadership. We reached out and drew upon our shared work, history, and values and provided education on our new dreams and appreciation for all they have done to support the Foundation and group therapy. We have had a good response for new and increased annual pledge commitments.

We have received a number of special gifts in honor of AGPA's 75th Anniversary, some of which are gifts for our ongoing programs and some of which are for new special funds; four new Endowed Scholarship Funds have been established as part of the campaign. This whole area of giving deserves an article of its own, and I will be talking about it more in-depth in the next newsletter.

A third area of giving we are focusing on is increasing contributions through planned giving, such as bequests. Please consider the Group Foundation as part of your estate planning. I have personally learned there are many creative ways that you can contribute with different assets to fit your current needs and tax considerations.

Most importantly, we are building relationships. We have had incredibly positive responses from the people to whom we have already reached out and to the activities we have initiated to thank and inform donors (including, for example, special advance emails of our Group Assets newsletter highlighting activities and thanking donors).
